Bird News I

John Croxton further enhanced his claims for nature reserve status for his garden with a Spotted Flycatcher on the 1st. This is late in the year for our area and there are not many October records.

There were still Wheatears on the moors early in the month and Siskins in Littlewood.

The 11th October was a warm sunny day and a Great Spotted Woodpecker was drumming and a Skylark singing on Kenn Moor – they must have thought it was spring.

By mid-month there were lots of birds along the seawall. A flock of 70 Greenfinches was particularly welcome as there seem to be few in gardens and suburbia.

Meadow Pipits and Linnets were both in loose flocks of over 100 whilst 40 Skylarks and 10 Stonechats were good counts.

All of this attracted the attention of a young Merlin, which perched on pieces of flotsam just as Merlins should.

Rather more unexpected was a Little Owl, occupying one of the Barn Owl boxes at Blakes Pools – the first that I have noted there for several years.

I have not yet (21st) seen any Fieldfares or Redwings locally but Jill and I saw a nice flock of 200 Fieldfares in mid-Wales so no doubt they will be with us soon.
